What Does It Take?

This is my first newsletter since beginning at St. Francis. I thought I would start out with a few thoughts about how someone qualifies to do what Jesus asks us to do. I hope you enjoy this message;

There have been many times when someone will ask me a very good theological and/or biblical question at the door of church immediately after our worship service is over. Ido feel honored that people trust me to answer those questions. Often I do an adequate job at giving an answer. Little do they know, however, that after the service I am usually spent and in need of some alone time. I may not catch the question or actually give an answer that gets to the deeper root of the question. Underneath all of this is that many people will approach me with great respect for my position assuming that I am the expert in ministry. The case is, however, that theological training is not the best training for ministry.

All You Need Is Love

Of course, that is simplistic, but it is catchy. It helps me to remember that the most important and absolutely necessary qualification for ministry is love for Jesus. Three times Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me?". This helped Peter overcome any lingering guilt for denying Jesus three times. Peter answered each time saying he did love Jesus. Only then each time did Jesus tell him, "Feed my sheep." While a small percentage of Christians are seminary trained there are many, many Christians who love Jesus deeply. Our pews are hosts to millions all over the world who love Jesus with all of their hearts. Are you one of them? Your love for Jesus is the best qualification for ministry possible.
