Inviting someone along to your group, or church, or organization for the good of the organization may not be the best first move to make. Seeing if someone wants to come along with you so that they might grow in some way could be a far better way to go. In other words, your influence on someone is meant to be for his or her benefit. It is good to be always looking ahead for the blessing of others.

Do It Like Jesus

When Jesus invited people to follow Him, one of the main results He was looking for was their growth into becoming all they were created to be. When the centurion sent some of his servants to ask Jesus to heal a servant who was sick in his home, he did it for the benefit of the sick servant. The centurion saw a servant who was healed, whole and strong. When you are ready to invite someone to church, are you doing it primarily for the benefit of the church or for the blessing of the person you are inviting? Do it for the same reason Jesus would do it.
