Understanding the time we are in becomes deeper and richer when we stand in a good spot to see. We can look and not see if we think that to struggle to get anywhere is because we are not worthy of the goals we are trying to reach. We settle for something that eventually leaves us used up and hungry. If first we take hold of our worthiness we will accurately see what goes on around us. That worthiness comes from knowing Jesus. To know Him is to be transformed by Him. It is not possible to know Him and be left the same.

The Effects

You will see what God is already doing in the world around you. People who seem very far from any kind of Christian lifestyle may be very close to the presence of God. God, in fact, may be powerfully drawing that person closer in a way that is not easily seen. When you have taken hold of the worthiness Jesus gives you will be able to look at others through His eyes. The purpose will be to bring God's peace to others. Sometimes the process of moving towards peace is very uncomfortable leading to some conflict. You will be able to navigate that conflict when you see what Jesus sees and can interpret the times through His lenses. How is Jesus asking you to take hold of the worthiness He has for you? What is Jesus showing you right now?
