And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan has bound for eighteen years, be loosed from the bond on the Sabbath day? Luke 13:15

Jesus' Portrait

When you picture Jesus what do you see? Different people will naturally see different things. One of the main pictures in the minds of many people is that God will act specifically on the behalf of Jesus. One implication of this is that if you are in a right relationship with Jesus then you will get the same benefits that Jesus gets, if you are not, then you won't. One very interesting observation is that the only figure in the bible who says he holds that picture of Jesus is Satan in Luke chapter 4. What we see in the gospels is something very different. We see Jesus spreading the outward signs of the kingdom of God. Those signs are shared with many different kinds of people, not just those with a "right" relationship with God. Jesus extends signs and promises of the kingdom of God are given to prostitutes, adulterers, condemned thieves, Samaritans, and all kinds of Gentiles.

Why Is That?

Jesus is continuing the promise made through Abraham that God would bless every family on earth (Genesis 22:18; Acts 3:25). By bringing signs of the Kingdom of God through the healing of this woman on a Sabbath day, Jesus is announcing freedom, release, mercy, and life to all the families of the earth. The Sabbath is meant to be holy. Holiness is the life of God. The best practice of the Sabbath is to be in the position to have the life of God flow through you.

Who does This Today?

We do. Our relationship with Jesus is not only for our benefit. It is so we can grow into the ones who bring the blessing of God to all the families of the earth. Who comes to your mind that God might be preparing to receive the blessing of the kingdom through you?
