The Hands and Feet of Jesus

It is easy to want to be kind to others so that they will be kind to you. That is natural. That desire can go deeper when you want to be kind to others because that is the type of person you want to be. Taking it a step further, we can want to be kind because that is the way we reflect and communicate the presence of Jesus.

The Fruit of the Spirit

The big question is how do we actually reflect and communicate the presence of Jesus to others through our personal kindness and gentleness. The answer is generally the same as it is with any other question of how to live a Christian life. We do it in the power of the Holy Spirit. To communicate His presence to others we must first know His presence within our own lives. His Spirit gives us power to do what we cannot do on our own. The strength of His kindness and gentleness flows through us because of the presence of God within us. We do not have that kind of strength on our own. Gentleness and kindness are a part of the fruit of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22) in our lives.

Kindness First

Who do you know that really would not believe they are welcome to receive from God, or to take part in worship on Sunday morning (the poor, the crippled, the lame and the blind)? The kindness of Jesus flowing through you will go a long way in opening their eyes to that belief.
