Passion Audit

The master commended the dishonest manager because he was shrewd.

Luke 16:15

What?

This parable sounds very strange to our ears. Taking a close look we can see a few things:

- 1. The manager know he was wrong- he did not offer any defense. In that culture there was usually a few days of haggling after your boss told you that you were fired in hopes you could keep your job. This manager knew he was caught
- 2. The manager hatches a plan and makes the boss's debtors complicit in a dishonest (or even illegal scheme). The manager had some leverage after

he would be out on the street.

3.Here is the strangest thing- the boss commends the manager for being shrewd (not for being dishonest).

Why?

Remember Jesus told parables primarily to build faith. He uses some shocking turns and twists in this story to underline one thing: The boss is a merciful and generous man. The manager took the risk based on his faith that his boss was merciful and generous. That applies to us this way- we can takes risks of faith (John Wimber used to say faith is spelled r-i-s-k) because of the generosity and mercy of God.

 $So\dots$

What is your greatest desire, your passion? You can follow that and bear fruit for the kingdom of God because of the mercy and generosity of God. This Sunday I will be asking you to consider what God is saying to you about these questions, and what does He want you to do about them:

What are your heart's desires? What are you passionate about? What excites you (kids, environment, people, family, healing, etc., etc., etc., . . .)?

What is your holy discontent? What grieves or saddens you? What do you see and think "that's not fair!" (kids on street corners, litter, abuse, families breaking up, etc., etc., etc., etc., . . .)

What are the opportunities? Where are there places of grace, influence and invitation?

What are the strengths and assets of the community? Where could you be a blessing/good news to the local community? How could you strengthen those assets and strengths?

What have you heard from God? What has God said in the past, through Scripture and other people, about the present or the future?*

One of those questions may make your calling, gifting, and passion clearer. You are engaged with a God who empowers you to go into it.

*I do not remember where I found this so I cannot give the author credit. I did adapt a few of the questions for use at St. Francis.
