Children's Ministry

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 19:14

What Should We Do About Children's Ministry?

Of course, this is a very important area of ministry. I have been asked that question a few times since starting here at St. Francis seven months ago. The vestry has talked about it also at its last meeting. Often this question comes up out of anxiety about survival. "If we do not get some young families with children our church will die," is implied in one way or another. While that is true, it really is not a helpful motivation for developing any ministry. Let me suggest another way.

Who Is Called To Children's Ministry?

Instead of asking, "how will we survive without children's ministry," it is more fruitful to begin by asking "how can children's ministry spring from the ways we are thriving as a fellowship". Usually that question will lead us to a person who is already called by God to minister with children (notice I wrote "with instead of "to"). The fellowship then works to equip and encourage that person in ministry to children, helps to build a team of people to work with that person, and floods that ministry area with prayer. We will not be able to hold that kind of ministry back.

How Do We Proceed From Here?

We pray! We bring these requests to God:

1. We ask God to show us where He is already working in the lives of children in the

surrounding area and how we can join in with that work

2. We ask God to provide the person who is called to minister with children.

This is the person who would choose to minister with children above anything else.

3. We ask God to continue to form us into the kind of fellowship that will richly equip people

who called to such a level of ministry.

4. We ask God to show us which families and children in the area He is preparing to join

with us.

5. Finally we ask God to show us what kind of ministry would make the

gospel plausible to these families with young children.

We will be praying this way every Sunday at the prayers of the people. Join me in praying individually during the week for the same thing.
