So reach out and welcome one another to God's glory. Jesus did it; now you do it. Romans 15:7 (The Message)

An Open Door

Before Paul's conversion to Christ he spent most of his energy hunting down Christians. He led a brutal persecution against the church in Jerusalem. It became so dangerous to be a Christian that all Christians but the apostles fled Jerusalem (check out Acts chapter 8). You might remember that it was Paul who held the coats of those who stoned Stephen to death (take a look at Acts 7:54-60). After Paul met Christ on the road to Damascus (see Acts chapter 9) he stopped persecuting the church and started receiving from the church. One of the most deeply influential things the church did with Paul as a new Christian was to accept him fully and unconditionally despite his history of brutality with them. It formed Paul's discipleship, theology, and oversight of churches later in his life. It is one reason he directs us to welcome one another as Christ has welcomed us. He experienced it personally.

Opening the Door Today

Most Christians I know are friendly. Most of them also have their preferences about church life, worship style, and pastors. While those preferences can be helpful for keeping up disciplines of worship, they can also block our ability to welcome people as Jesus has welcomed us. We welcome people to the degree that we invest in their success even if they have different preferences about church life and worship than we do. We seek to welcome others the same way Jesus welcomes them. What matters is the fruit of discipleship that brings glory to God. Everything else is in second place to that.

An Open Door To Jesus

Is there some way Jesus wants you to be more open to Him than you have in the past? Is there a new area He wants to influence in your life? Will you welcome Him there in the same way He has welcomed you?
