

Your Parish Church is an Instrument of the Kingdom of God

The story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead is filled with great power and significance. There are some very prominent New Testament players as well: Mary, Martha, Jesus (of course) the Twelve, and the main beneficiary Lazarus. There are some unnamed people right there also. They see the miracle of Lazarus being raised from the dead, hear everything Jesus says, and actually follow some of the instructions Jesus gives immediately after Lazarus comes out of the grave. At Jesus instruction they take the grave clothes off of Lazarus. That is an essential next step for Lazarus. This group of unnamed people represent a local parish church. They follow the commands of Jesus so that each of the members can move fully into the new life Jesus has for them. In that way, among others, every church is an instrument of the Kingdom of God. They participated in the mission of God to extend the Kingdom mercy and love throughout the entire world.

Two Things Stand Out

For this to happen two things seem to stand out for this group that will also stand out for us. First of all, they did what Jesus said to do. Knowing His voice, listening for it, following after Him, growing in our character to be like Him and doing what He is able to do are all the basic practices of the Christian life. For any fellowship of any size to be an instrument of the Kingdom of God it is essential to be able to follow Jesus like this. Secondly, as Lazarus sister, Martha, pointed out, Lazarus had been in the grave for four days and would stink. The people who took off the grave clothes of Lazarus would have been the closest to that smell. Our communities are not exempt from messiness and very unpleasant difficulties. Yet, to follow Jesus and be an instrument of the Kingdom of God we do what the friends of Lazarus did, we unbind each other and release each other into the life God has for us. Such a fellowship would prove to have great influence in the surrounding community.
