

Peace Be With You

John 20:19, 21, 26

What Is The Peace Jesus Gives?

Most of us will hold, not incorrectly, to a definition of peace making the word mean "an absence of conflict or hostility." With some more thought we will also acknowledge it means a sense of well being. Jesus (as usual) means more than that. He says to His followers three times very soon after the resurrection, "Peace be with you." The first time is showing them He is alive. The second time is sending them into the world, and the third time is telling Thomas, and by extension all of us, to believe. It seems to me we may need the peace of Jesus to

live lives showing He is alive, we are sent by Him, and we do trust in Him with all of our strength. To my mind His peace is the flow of His life, mercy, and love into and through our lives. That puts us in the position to become all we were created to be.

How Do We Get It?

Notice that Jesus says "peace be with you" each time. I think you get His peace by having Him create it in your life, work, and relationshipos. When He says something He is creating something, just as He did in Genesis 1. When you and I are in a position to hear His voice by drawing near to Him He will create within our lives, work and relationships. One of the primary things He creates in us is His peace. It was one of His first priorities immediately after the resurrection. How does Jesus want you to listen for His voice? Try it and see what happens.
