Disturbing

It is easy to put a "do not disturb" sign on the door of our lives. There are times when it is actually necessary for us to rest to such a degree that we are, in fact, working from rest instead of resting from work (see the wonderful resources from Mike Breen and others at weare3dm.com). However, if you take the approach that you are in charge of your rest, time off, and every other aspect of your life then the Holy Spirit may actually be out to disturb you. The Spirit of God wants to take charge of how the love of God is spread around. The methods of the Spirit may not be our methods. Those methods actually might be very disturbing. They are like a powerful river that relentlessly flows on to the sea.

Good Things Run Wild

It was G.K Chesterton who wrote that the order of the church was in place to allow good things to run wild. I have to admit that I often do not like it when anything runs wild. The God who I serve, love, and follow is a wild God who looks for good things to run wild. Following Jesus into the depths of someone else's dream, or trouble, so that I can join in with what He is doing can be a very wild and disturbing way of life. Yet when we pray for the Holy Spirit to fall on us we are inviting that wild Spirit to come and take over. It is a lot more than getting over problems, hardships, and tough questions. It is entering into a wild lifestyle while we are being healed and established. It is a wild ride that does not end.
