The Goal

Our goal is to spread the kingdom of God wherever we go (see the Book of Common Prayer, page 856). The best way of accomplishing that task is through a group of people committed to living the way Jesus lived. That is

different from a group who knows what Jesus did, or a group who knows what Jesus said. A group living as Jesus lived would be committed to spreading the Kingdom of God together and building each other up to spread the kingdom of God when the group is not together. Success has two components: 1. spreading the kingdom of God in new areas, and 2. equipping each other to fruitfully spread the kingdom of God in their own lives.

How Does This Work?

For a group to succeed at this it must have an outward focus. Each member of the group would be committed to engaging with and serving an outside group together. For example, a group might be employees of a certain type of business or profession, or athletes in a particular sport, or volunteers in one kind of service or another. A group within the church serves a group outside of the church. That is how the gospel is spread from "house to house" as it was in the Acts of the Apostles. When the outside group begins receiving the group from within the church it has begun to receive Jesus. As that is going on the group within the church supports each other in prayer and encouragement so that the whole group can live out life together in the way Jesus did.

Who is Jesus calling you to serve. Is there a team you can join serving the same group?
