

... in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit Matthew 28:19

In the Name

How do you think of God? Do you think that one God sends one person (maybe you) to do something. That is very intimidating, even if you are ordained! It is also not an accurate picture of God. God is a community, better known as the Trinity. It is that Community which empowers and sends us into the world. As Mike and Sally Breen point out in their book, <u>Family On Mission</u>, "At Jesus' baptism, the Trinity is revealed, and his identity is confirmed: he is sent from a family to represent a family. Specifically the family of the Trinity, the household of heaven.

Following Jesus

If Jesus is sent from a family to represent a family, and we follow Jesus, wouldn't it be the case that we too live out our Christian lives in a community, as a family on mission? If he is from the household of heaven, and we follow him, wouldn't we then also do what he did? That would be to do what God asks of us with others instead of alone. Those others would be the same ones who have been asked by God to do the same thing God has asked us to do. To follow Jesus is to gather together as households on the same mission.

One More Thought

Many people think their ordained leaders do the work of ministry the best when they work alone. Many churches will look for ordained leaders who will single-handedly increase attendance, the budget, and the programs offerings. It is important to keep this in mind: Jesus did not do it alone, and neither can anyone else, ordained or not. Everyone needs to be in a household of faith on a mission.
