Glorified

By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples John 15: 8

Exactly How Is God Glorified?

It is good to glorify God. However, just how to glorify can be puzzling. It is not enough to shout, "Glory!" and leave it at that. There is something about our lifestyle which would glorify God. It would be to do what Jesus did. He

made disciples. That's what it is to bear fruit. It is bearing fruit which glorifies God. The conclusion is living a lifestyle in which you make disciples of Jesus is what glorifies God.

How Do You Do That?

To have clear excellent sermons, wonderful liturgy, and well done programs will contribute to the fruit bearing process, but will not likely end up producing new fruit. Those aspects of church life can serve to support the main business of the church- making new followers of Jesus. Things reproduce after their own kind. Disciples make new disciples. Sermons, liturgies, and programs can strengthen current disciples, but will not make new disciples by themselves. The first steps of becoming a disciple who bears fruit is to pay attention to these two questions:

1. What is God telling you right now?

2. What does God want you to do about that?
