Closest to the Source

It is very likely you know people who seem to be in need. It is very easy to immediately come up with some way to meet that need as quickly as possible. That kind of generosity and compassion are to be encouraged and commended. It can, however, sometimes not actually meet the need. The solution to the matter is most likely found at the source of the situation. The competent person closest to the situation is the most likely to have the best next step which would be brought through the strengths, assets, or gifts God has already given to that person.

A Listening Habit

The way to uncover the best solution is to listen. To be of real help to your friend you will want to know things like this:

What do you enjoy doing (or are good at)?
If there was one thing you would want to change about this situation what would it be?
If others were committed to the same thing would you want to start getting together with them?

Listening to these answers lets you in on what your friend loves, dreams about, and would share with others. Encouraging those things would bring a stronger, more sustainable solution to any situation. Check out the gospel for this coming Sunday. Its Matthew 14:13-22, the story of the feeding of the five thousand. Take note of where Jesus got the loves and fish. How did Jesus find out they were available? You will find that Jesus was listening. He calls and empowers us to do the same.
