The Gates of Hell

... upon this rock I shall build my church, and the gates of hell will not prevail against it. Matthew 16:18

What Are The Gates of Hell?

The gates of hell are any barriers at all to the influence and rule of the blessings of God anywhere at all. The blessings of God are the signs the Kingdom of God is present with us now: healing the sick, feeding the hungry, restoring relationships, provision for the needy, etc., etc. Anything that blocks the reception of those items are gates. Don Everetts and Doug Shaup co-authored a book entitled I Once Was Lost which describes five thresholds a person might go through before beginning to follow Jesus. I wonder if they are the gates of hell as we might experience them now. They are: 1. trusting a christian, 2. becoming curious about the Christian Faith, 3. opening up to change, 4. seeking after God, 5. entering the kingdom. Like me, you probably know people who are moving through these gates, or thresholds, into a lifetime of following Jesus. We can do that with them.

The Gates of Hell Will Not Prevail

In other words, these five gates will not keep us away from the lives of our friends as they receive more and more of the great things God has for them. Our job is to work, pray and give for the spread of this kingdom (see the Book of Common Prayer, page 856). The way you and I live, the way we spend our time and money, the way we forgive, volunteer, pray, and actively build up the dignity of every person we know will push open the gates so that our lives can be a great encouragement to those Jesus is drawing to himself. Who do you know that may be behind one of those gates? How is God asking you to live so that you follow Jesus through those gates?
