The law of your mouth is dearer to me than thousands in gold and silver Psalm 119:72

The Law

A lot of Christians will hold a negative view of the law. By "the law" I mean the rules, statutes, and regulations of the Old Testament. They think that the law is inferior to the grace offered in the New Testament. However, the law is a very positive part of the Word of God. The higher view one has of the law the deeper the experience of the grace of God offered through Jesus Christ. If you realize you cannot keep any part of the law in your own power you will also realize how much of a gift God's grace is to you. Your experience of grace will be deeper and your gratitude will be richer. Paul in the New Testament describes the law as a tutor pointing us to Jesus.

Grace

The only one who perfectly keeps the law is God Himself, which we see in Jesus. To follow, trust, and lean on Jesus is to receive His grace and power because we know we cannot follow, trust, and lean on Him in our own power. It is to know that we have been called by Jesus to live as He did and to know at the same time we have no power in ourselves to in that manner. It is to know that He will freely give us that power to follow after Him all the time. For that reason the words of Psalm 119:72 ring very true, "The law of your mouth is dearer to me than thousands in gold and silver."
