The Challenge of Blessing

Then I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse! The one sitting on it is called Faithful and True . . . Revelation 19:11

First of All . . .

Happy 2015 to all!! May God bless you more than you are able to imagine this year. I take great confidence that can happen because of what we celebrate this week- The Feast of The Holy Name of Jesus. In secular circles it is called NewYear's Day. We look to the strength of the Name of Jesus for a solid foundation for our lives.

Some of What This Means

One thing it means is that things will change. The only absolute is change, actually. In fact, the name of Jesus in this passage cited above shows us how we can join in with change and be blessed richly by it. Firstly, He is "Faithful." Jesus is faithful to lead us, empower us, and challenge us, to become who He created us to be. That will always mean change. We are becoming, by His grace, all we are meant to be. Secondly He is "True." He is true to what we always have been. There is a thread running through our lives of who we always truly are. No matter what changes occur in our lives Jesus wants to hold onto that thread running through our lives that will never change. That is how He created us.

How Change Can Be a Blessing

Sometimes we get into a way of doing things which becomes comfortable but does not allow us to reach our goals, or become who we are meant to be. Realizing what is valuable in what we are doing while rising to new levels of performance or fruitfulness will allow us to see what is always true about us. Making any changes that allow us to become more of who we really are will enable us to be faithful to all Jesus has called us to do and be. We carry what we have valued into a new future. That is always a great blessing.
