# **Fat Burning Activities**

... their heart is unfeeling like fat, but I delight in your law.

Psalm 119:70

### An Unfeeling Heart

This is a very arresting verse from Psalm 119 appointed for morning prayer this morning. It reveals the source of an unfeeling heart. The reason mentioned here is lack of regard for the law of God. If you have ever been told you do not care, or you do not listen, or you are insensitive, or you

need to "walk a mile in their shoes," or any number of things like that a good first step for you might be to examine how you actually feel about the law of God. If it is something you do not like, would rather avoid, and think is way too judgemental then you may have an unfeeling heart. The cure for an unfeeling heart is to delight in the law of God.

### Delighting in the Law of God

The first question that many have about delighting in the law of God is this, "How do I do that?" This question reveals a legalistic approach to life. We seek to do everything on our own power. However, the question "how do I do that?" could also very powerfully open the door to an ability to delight in the law of God. When the answer is, "by the grace and power of God and not on our own," it makes all the difference. The law God wants us to follow is this:

Love the Lord your God with all of your heart, all of your mind, all of your soul and all of your strength.... You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these. Mark 12:30+31

The only way to love like this and deight in it is by the power and grace of God. In one sense, when we ask, "how do I do that?" we can be hiding from the grace of God. Any time we want to do something for God on our own power we are hiding from God's grace. There is a very simple, but very challenging discipline for this. When you feel the question starting to rise in your mind, "how do I do that?" replace it with "Jesus, what would you have me do about that?". As you follow Jesus in that way you will begin to see the power of His grace as you love God with all you have and your neighbor as youself. There is great delight in that.
