Together Then

Yesterday, March 3rd, was the commemoration of of John and Charles Wesley on our liturgical calendar. In two weeks on March 17th it will be the commemoration of Patrick of Ireland. These commemorations can be lost in the middle of Lent. They point to significant ministry in the history of our church which can be done today. Some of the practices would be different now than they were in the time of the Wesleys or Patrick. Even though they lived in different centuries and cultures they had several very important practices in common. One of those practices was living out the Christian life together with a group of people. Patrick would bring a large group to a village to introduce the Christian Faith and see it established. The Wesleys would organize groups of different sizes to strengthen new converts and reach out to new people. In both cases it was very fruitful. These groups were, in both instances, like large households or families. They mirrored the very powerful evangelistic ministry we see in the New Testament.

Together Now

We can take the same approach adapted to our own culture and situation. When we gather in groups to worship, encourage each other, and serve people outside of our groups we begin to see some progress in sharing the faith. It is much less effective to try to share our faith individually. Seeing how Christians relate to each other and, in turn, welcome outsiders into a group is a very powerful witness of the love of God.
