Brene Brown offers this definition of shame in her book <u>Women and Shame</u>, "Shame is the intensely painful feeling or experience of believing we are flawed and therefore unworthy of acceptance and belonging." The

core of this description of shame, in my opinion, is believing we are unworthy of acceptance or belonging because of being flawed. That sense of unworthiness can be something we carry around throughout our lives. It is the result of hopelessness.

Hope

Hopelessness can come from having an expectation that others will always treat us with respect. While that is a natural expectation it is not a reasonable one. We simply will not always be treated respectfully. When we cannot let go of the demand to be treated with respect at all times we can become hopeless. However, when we accept in our hearts and souls that "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us (Romans 5:4)," we have every reason to hope because we are fully accepted. The first One to fully accept us is the merciful God of all love and comfort. With that acceptance comes hope. It is that hope which removes all shame.

Can you think of a way right now God is demonstrating full acceptance to you? Is there an expectation the Holy Spirit is prompting you to release? Open up to the gifts the Spirit of God is giving you.
