Belonging

The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one . . . John 17:22

Glory

In the section of the gospel of John selected to be read at Evening Prayer this evening we come across the above passage from the great priestly prayer of Jesus in John 17. Jesus talks about a gift and the results of receiving that gift. The gift He gives us is His glory. It is the glory that is present with the Trinity. It is the glory shared between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit that is now shared with us. It reminds me of something else Jesus said shortly before praying this prayer, "By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples (John 15:8)." The gift of the glory of God results in a new ability to bear fruit, and a new ability to bear fruit together in unity.

How Does This Work?

Our ability to bear fruit, or to extend the kingdom of God, is given to us by God. The closer we are to Him the more we will bear fruit. As Jesus points out, bearing fruit glorfies God. It is one of the main ways we see the glory of God. Staying close to Jesus, doing what He does, and becoming like Him is something we do with others. It is not possible to bear fruit alone. Sharing our faith, reaching out to encourage and be with others, working for a better community, and much more is done in a way that glorifies God when we do this with others.

Belonging

This raises a challenge for us. It can be very tempting to be involved in everything. The result is that we then belong to nothing. A sense of belonging to a certian group which is working on a certain focus is essential. That is the group with the deepest unity and the best fruit. It goes even deeper when you have the confidence that Jesus gave you that focus and gathered you together with others around that focus. It is a life lived belonging to what Jesus gives you that runs the deepest and gives glory to God.
