Punishment or Resistance?

It can be easy to feel as if you have done something awful if you make some spiritual progress and then things go wrong. You may start to think that you made an very bad mistake in the eyes of God and are being punished. There is, however, a different way looking at difficulties and trials. When you make spiritual progress you are in a position to see what the future may hold. You are at a high point and from there can see the next high point. Difficulties and trials are found in the valley between the two high points. Hard times are not punishment from God for doing something imperfectly in the past. They are resistance to the fulfillment of the

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promise of the future that is yet to come. That is what Jesus meant by His question, "Where is your faith?" we see in the reading from Morning Prayer today. The apostles were on thier way with Jesus to set a man free. the storm was not punishment for some past mistake they had made, of which there were plenty. The storm was resistance to the future promise of God that was about to be realized in the life of the man beset by demons in the graveyard in the "country of the Gerasenes."

Overcoming Resistance

When you make some spiritual progress of any kind you will find yourself encouraged and motivated to keep going. Difficulties are not the signal to stop growing spiritually. They are the sign that your next stage of growth is nearer. The actual act of overcoming resistance prepares you for the promises you have yet see fulfilled in your life, just like the wings of a butterfly develop by forcing its way out of a cocoon. How do you overcome resistance? Build your faith. It is the substance of things you have yet to see. How do you build your faith? Listen for the promptings of God in prayer, Bible reading, and fellowship, and then go and do what God asks you to do. That is the basic Christian life. That kind of life continually overcomes resistance.
