I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for my namesake, and you have not grown weary. But I have this against you, you have abandoned the love you had at first. Revelation 2:3+4

First Love

In the readings for morning prayer this morning we find this verse in the middle of the letter from Jesus to the church in Ephesus. It is both encouraging and convicitng at the same time. The main reason for this has to do with the nature of repentance. In essence, to repent is to return to your first love. It is to turn back from drifting away from your first love. It is to spend time with Jesus, listen to His voice, and practice what He tells you to do over and over again throughout your life.

Returning

What can you do to return to your first love? Recalling what it was like when you first conciously started to follow Jesus can be very motivating and go a long way. However, it can go deeper than that. Returning to your first love is returning to the practice of building the relationship. What is Jesus telling you right now? What would He want you to do about that? How can you grow in that practice? All of that is more than doing the right thing. It is returning to your first love.
