Frances Joseph-Gaudet

Today in our litugical calendar we remember the life and minsitry of Frances Joseph-Gaudet. She dedicated her life to prison and education reform. She lived and worked most of her life in the New Orleans area. After years of helping prisoners of all races in the late 1800's she began taking in young offenders who were convicted of misdemeanors or vagrancy. After taking in too many for her own house she raised money, bought a farm, and stared a boarding school for homeless children, orphans, and the children of working mothers. In 1919 she donated the facility to the Episcopal Diocese of Louisiana and stayed on two more years as the principal.

The Road from Relief to Transformation

France's Joseph-Gaudet started out bringing much needed relief to prisoners supplying clothes and other necessities. Her committment widened to include working with the Prison Reform Association. That, along with the boarding school she founded, gave the thousands of lives she touched a foundation and an education to change all of their circumstances. She began providing relief for individuals. The road she walked brought her to work for the transformation of whole communities. She focused on addressing the causes of crime and homelessness during her era as well as providing the relief that many needed. That is an essential distinction. When we provide help and relief we are working in the kingdom of God. When we adress causes and begin working for the transformation of communities we are extending the kingdom of God. It is in extending the Kingdom of God we answer our calling, just as we see in the life of Frances Joseph-Gaudet.
