Time or Space?

They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord. Isaiah 60:1-6

Jerusalem

The prophecy given through Isaiah cited above is one of the readings for the Feast of the Epiphany which we celebrate today. The content of the prophecy is about the city of Jerusalem. Much of it is about the nations coming to Jerusalem offering gifts and wealth to the city. Later we see what seems to be a fulfillment of this prophecy. There is one difference between the actual prophecy and its fulfillment. The kings and wealth come to Jesus soon after his birth not to the city of Jerusalem. This, of course, is the familiar story of the Magi visiting Jesus because they saw the rising of His star. There seems to be a shift going on between the time of Isaiah and the time of the birth of Jesus. What Isaiah says points to a place (Jerusalem). What happens later happens to a person (Jesus). That shift is very significant.

Time or Space?

We all have special places in our lives. Our home town, our schools, places where very significant events took place all bring us very fond memories. They are important to us. We also have special people in our lives. Some of them we see often, others we have not seen for years, and may never see again. They do, however, remain special people to us no matter where we are. Jesus is the One who is beyond any specific place, even sacred spaces. Jesus transcends all geographical boundaries. Wherever we go He is there. The mercy, power, love, grace, and provision that is His is also everywhere because He is everywhere. The discipline to which Epiphany calls us is to see Him everywhere. He is present even in the places we would would not expect to find Him. We can look for Him and find Him even in the places we would be shocked to see Him. He is there before we get there. The flow of all history is not going ultimately to one place. It is going ultimately to one Person. We can engage with Him now wherever we are. We can ask Him to show us where He is wherever we go. Do you see Him right where you are right now?
