... and the lot fell to Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles Acts 1:26

Matthias

Today is the Feast of St. Matthias. He was chosen by lot to fill the vacancy among the apostles Jesus chose left by Judas Iscariot. After his selection he is not mentioned again in the New Testament. While there is a tradition that he was an exemplary apostle, he is nameless and faceless in Christian history after his selection as an apostle. This gives rise to many interesting explanations leading to different views on the nature of apostolic ministry. There is, however, something far more compelling about the story of Matthias. This apostle lived in a way which presents a very deep challenge to us.

Following Matthias' Example Today

The apostolic ministry of Matthias has gone completely unnoticed except for his reputation as an exemplary apostle. None of his activity, work, visits, ministry, or teaching is recorded. He had been with Jesus and the others from the beginning and would know how to do the work of ministry as well as the other apostles. Nothing, however, is recorded. That is the challenge to us. How much are we willing to do to work, pray and give for the extension of the kingdom of God without being noticed at all? To take it one step further, how many of us plan a "secret history" with God in which we try not to be noticed for following the ways of Jesus? It is important not to take that too far. We need the encouragement and accountability of others to follow Jesus. We also need to die to ourselves, take up our cross and follow Him. The balance between a secret history with Jesus and an accountable, transparent life gives us a life that looks more and more like the life of Jesus. Where does that balance lie for you?
